

Spring and/or Summer 2010 Internships

19th Century Willowbrook Village is seeking advanced undergraduate or graduate students interested in internships for the following positions: .

Programs Support Intern

This internship will involve participation in most day-to-day site activities (interacting with the public, speaking to school groups, curatorial duties (as needed) along with a research or other project determined by prior agreement between the intern and the Willowbrook internship supervisor. In addition, assistance with annual special event programs will be needed. Prospective Program Support Interns should have a background in history, American studies, museum studies, elementary education, decorative arts, art history, or other related field, and be prepared to spend 8 hours per week on their internship work.

Marketing Support Intern

This internship will provide marketing and advertising support. Willowbrook, the largest 19th Century museum in New England, features exhibits displaying over 10,000 artifacts in 34 structures depicting rural life in Maine and New England during the 1850s to 1920s and illustrating the impact of innovation and industrialization during that period. In addition, Willowbrook offers educational programming and demonstrations of historic trades and crafts. This internship is a crucial part of the marketing team, working with databases, creating and managing various contact lists and assisting with mass mailings, e-blasts and other tasks. This is a great opportunity to learn and implement marketing strategies and to build your resume. MS Word, Excel, general office equipment, is helpful.

No funding is available for intern stipends this year. These internships will be on a voluntary basis.

Willowbrook staff will work with interns to fulfill requirements necessary for students to receive academic credit for their internships. Start dates and hours are flexible.
